**INSIGHTS TOUR** Our signature tour | 90 minutes

Daily | Hourly 9 am-4 pm (every half hour November-April) Cost | \$32 adults.\*

The living quarters and the dramatic Taliesin West "Garden Room" are the highlights of this tour, which also includes all the elements of the Panorama Tour. The living room was the social gathering place for Wright and the many famous guests he entertained. Visitors experience the drama of being a guest in Wright's famous home.

### PANORAMA TOUR | 1 hour

Daily | 10:15 am & 2:15 pm. Cost | \$24 adults.\*

Experience Wright's brilliant ability to integrate indoor and outdoor spaces. Visit the Cabaret Theater, Music Pavilion, Seminar Theater and Wright's private office—all linked by dramatic terraces, gardens, and walkways overlooking the rugged Sonoran Desert. See how the site itself amplifies the desert's beauty.

### **BEHIND THE SCENES TOUR** | 3 hours

No children under 12 on this tour.

Mondays, Thursdays & Saturdays, 9:15 am Cost | \$60. Reservations recommended.

A highlight of this tour is a stop in the colorful Taliesin Fellowship dining room where you'll be treated to mid-morning tea. You'll speak with Wright associates and examine several unique desert structures. Architecture enthusiasts consistently cite this tour as a highlight of their travels.

### NIGHT LIGHTS TOUR | 2 hours

September and May: Friday, 6:30, 7 and 7:30 pm October, February, March, & April: Friday, 6, 6:30 and 7 pm December 27, 28, & 30: 5:30, 6:00, and 6:30 pm Cost | \$35 adults.\* Reservations requested, but not required.

Wright's desert masterpiece in the nighttime takes on a luminous, jewel-like quality. The structures, lighted from within, appear as sculptures. The renown fire-breathing dragon sculpture transforms into a link with the Valley lights below. A truly dramatic, romantic setting. This tour includes all the spaces shown on the Insights Tour, plus refreshments. Highly recommended as an enchanting way to view Wright's home.

### **DESERT WALK** | 90 minutes

Desert tours require appropriate footwear. No children under 12 on this tour.

Daily | 10:45 am November-April only (Weather permitting) Cost | \$32 Desert Walk only. \$45-\$52 when combined with other tours. Reservations requested, but not required.

A guided "Desert Walk" explores the beautiful desert trails at Taliesin West. Guides reveal how native materials and landforms were translated into design elements by Wright. Desert wildlife (javelina, tortoise and coyote to name a few) may enliven the walk.

# **DESERT "SHELTER" TOUR** | 2 hours

Desert tours require appropriate footwear.

No children under 12 on this tour.

Mid-November-April: Saturdays & Sundays, 1:15 pm (Weather permitting)

Cost | \$40 adults.\* Reservations recommended.

First-year architecture students at Taliesin West generally live in simple eight-foot square shepherds' tents (later designing more elaborate "shelters" for themselves). Our students will host you on an "up close and personal" visit to their desert dwellings.



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

Each tour inspires visitors with the innovative principles, beautiful creations, technological experiments, and unparalleled body of work of Frank Lloyd Wright. As a result, guests find the Taliesin West tour experience delightfully engaging and deeply relevant.
