Andrés Jaque is a New York-based architect. He is the founder of the Office for Political Innovation, an international agency working in the intersection of design, research and critical practices. The office has gained international relevance by claiming architecture's capacity to engage environmentally and to mediate in the negotiation of transespecies alliances. It has been awarded with the 2016 Frederick Kiesler Prize from the City of Vienna, the SILVER LION at the 14th Venice Biennale, and the Dionisio Hernández Gil Award, among many others. Its work is part of the MoMA Collection and has been exhibited in major contemporary art museums around the world, including London Design Museum, MAK in Vienna, Tel Aviv Museum of Art, ZKM in Karlsruhe, RED CAT Cal Arts Contemporary Art Center in Los Angeles, Z33 in Hasselt, Schweizerisches Architektur Museum in Basel, Princeton University SoA and the Cité de l'Architecture et du Patrimoine de Paris. It has been published in the most important architectural and general media, including A+U, Bauwelt, Domus, El Croquis, The Architectural Review and The New York Times, Wall Street Journal, The Guardian and El País.

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
